Rolls-Royce Youth Fund

Funds allocated by Rolls-Royce to Crowdfund Derby are for public and community benefit. Therefore, we apply very stringent eligibility criteria.

The project must:

- Benefit the people of Derby
- Be run by community organisations, charities or social enterprises ("not for profits")
- Benefit low income families or disadvantaged communities
- Have reached 25% of their fundraising target from multiple pledges
- Achieve 100% of its fundraising target for any funds pledged by Rolls-Royce to be released

Your organisation must:

- Have a governing document (constitution, set of rules or equivalent) that show how your group or organisation is run and managed.
- Have clearly defined aims and objectives
- Have a bank or building society account in the name of the group, with a minimum of two cheque signatories

What Rolls-Royce will fund through Crowdfund Derby

Eligible projects must benefit people living within the Derby City Council boundary and priority will be given to projects which fall within one or more of the following areas:

- Create opportunities that help young people grow in confidence and expand their understanding of the wider world
- Help young people develop their career aspirations and understanding of how to realise them
- Help young people engage with the world of work
- Help young people develop skills for employment

About Rolls-Royce grant funding

- Once an eligible project has raised 25% of their fundraising target from multiple pledges, Rolls-Royce may pledge to fund a further 25% of the target up to a maximum pledge of £1,000.
- The money pledged will be released only if 100% of the fundraising target of the Crowdfunder campaign at launch has been reached.
